New and Rising Student Transition

Our transition plan allows for all students to feel comfortable in the classroom, with their new routines, and with any new expectations or responsibilities.

For all children who will be new to the school, or those who are moving up to a new classroom, we will follow the following transition plan for the first three days.

Given the volume of families, we are asking that you follow the zones of times we have outlined below for pick-up and drop off. Our hope is that this will alleviate some of our parking-lot congestion and traffic in the hallways at the start of school. Thank you.

August 16:

Toddlers **8:00-8:30** drop-off **10:30-11** pick-up Primary **8:30-9:00** drop-off **11:00-11:30** pick-up

August 17:

Toddlers **8:00-8:30** drop-off **2:00-2:30** pick-up Primary **8:30-9:00** drop-off **2:30-3:00** pick-up

August 18:

Toddlers **8:00-8:30** drop-off – your typical pick-up time Primary **8:30-9:00** drop-off- your typical pick-up time

- Hours For the new school year our hours will change to 7:45am to 5:15pm moving forward.
- Change of clothes Please be sure your child has a full change of clothing appropriate for the season, including shoes.
- **Drop-off** We will continue with exterior doors for drop-offs into the fall, and will consider in-door access after the year starts for end-of-day.
- please apply sunscreen to your child. Teachers will apply additional sunscreen in the afternoon. If you would like to use your own sunscreen, please send in a bottle (non-aerosol spray) and a medical form.

Covid Screening at Drop-Off



Charlotte Montessori School uses the SchoolCues app for morning drop-off screening. See below the instructions to download the app and get started. If you have any questions, please contact Kathleen Dombkoski at adminassist@charlottemontessori.com.

- 1. Download the SchoolCues app and sign in (and/or create a new account). TIP: there are two versions, you'll want the parent platform which is green in color.
- 2. Watch the following video for how to use the app https://vimeo.com/452702543/ffefb77e00 (just as a point of clarification when watching the demo, we do not require anything other than the questions which will automatically populate for you to click through).
- 3. Once in the app, click on "check in screening" & submit your responses to the questions. While you will not be required to enter your child's temp, we do recommend taking your child's temp at home to make sure they do not have a fever ahead of arrival (see #5 below).
- 4. At the door, you will click on your QR code to present to your child's teacher, who will then scan it at the door for entry.
- 5. Your teacher will take your child's temperature at the door as the final step and enter their reading into the app.

We will also monitor the children (officially) twice daily for symptoms and check their temperatures.

What to Bring on the First Day of School

- Pack of child's diapers (toddlers only)
- Pack of wipes (toddlers only)
- Crib sized sheets for naptime mats and a soft blanket

- Two changes of clothing
- A spare pair of shoes
- Extra underwear (if applicable)
- Child's lunch (Returning students starting on the first day, new and rising students will bring lunch on Tuesday.)
- Family Photo

What Your Child's Teachers Would Like You to Know...



There is so much for you to think about when raising young children. We honor you as your child's first and best teachers, and our goal as your child's Montessori teachers is to collaborate with you. In service of that collaboration, we'd like to share with you some suggestions that will enrich your child's Montessori experience: When we ask you to arrive on time, it is to enhance your child's start to the school day. When your child arrives at the same time as the other children, they observe the morning routine, and thus naturally joins in, doing what comes next—greeting teachers and each other, putting belongings away, and entering the classroom with peers. This is a joyful time for your child. Arriving late means they miss this start to the day and must join the class already in progress. While this may be no big deal to adults, for many children it can be disorienting.

On the journey to and from school, we urge you to create the space for your child to engage with you, rather than with an electronic device. We also ask you to refrain from being on your own cell phone on the way to and from school. When you are using your phone in your child's presence, you have left your child. You may be in the same space, but you are not present. The same is true if you are on the phone during the moment of separation at the school door. You have already left, and your child feels it. Please save your calls and texts until after your child has separated from you. To learn how to leave (and to return to) loved ones is an important skill. Transitions can be challenging for both you and your child, but, nevertheless, separation is a significant ritual that happens best in the moment, in real time, rather than slipping gradually away through use of electronic devices.

One of the most important ways you can help your child gain confidence is by allowing him or her to take increasing self-responsibility. Allow them to walk into the school, rather than be carried by their own body. Your child can also take responsibility for their jacket, backpack, lunch box, and any other belongings. When you them to walk into school, carrying their own possessions, you foster their development of responsibility as a natural part of learning how to be independent.

At school, we seek to limit the number of parent events so as not to overwhelm your schedule. At the same time, we urge you to attend our parent education events. We create them especially for you. Our goal is to enhance our partnership with you by spending time together with you as adults, without children present. We offer topics that we think will be useful to you as parents and will further your understanding of Montessori. It's also a time for you to socialize with other parents who are doing exactly what you are doing—raising children in today's modern culture. There is much to learn from each other. Your questions and concerns are important, relevant, and useful for other parents as well.

And finally, please know that we want to see you, hear from you, and welcome you to be a part of our school. When your child sees you are happy to be here, he or she gets the message that this is a great place to spend the day!

As a reminder, when on school grounds with your child please follow the same limits that the school has in place with your child during the day.

- Children **should walk at all times** when not in a gated playground space, this includes our sidewalks and our parking lots.
- When on a walk, our primary children buddy up and hold hands. Our toddlers hold a rope and when old enough, a friend's hand. Hand-holding helps to keep everyone safe—please role model this for your child and practice while on school grounds.
- The stairs going to our second-floor offices and teacher lounge on the Cleveland side are not
 available to children or families—please refrain from allowing your child to climb or play on the
 stairs.

If your child is struggling to follow these limits, consult with your teacher for tips on how to keep them safe while with you at school. Often-times, it just requires a few pep-talks, and the expectation is clear. We are here to help if this is an area of struggle!

Our parking lots are busy areas, especially in the mornings and late afternoons. For the safety of all of us:

- Please remember to always drive with caution in our lots—even if you are running late!
- Remember that the lot at East is also part of an alleyway. There are cars that go through our lot
 and may not be as aware as all of us, especially about the presence of young children. We have
 installed some signage as reminders to our community and as an alert to others that they are in a
 "school zone."
- Once a child is released to a parent, it is the parent's responsibility to ensure their safety. Children
 must always be accompanied by an adult on school grounds and should either be holding an adult's
 hand or be picked up while going to and from their classroom and vehicle for added safety
 precautions.

Following these simple rules with your child will assist the child in understanding these limits while at school with their teachers and keep them safe with you when you are on campus.
